

## Results of chemical treatment survey due by 1/31/2022

The following letter was emailed on 1/15/2022 to lake district members whose names are on the email list and a similar one was mailed on 1/18/2022 to those whose names are not on the email list with an added option to respond by mail.

Hi White River Lake District neighbor,

As you probably know, Eurasian water milfoil (an aquatic invasive species) has been a very real problem on our lake. In 2021 we finished a 3 year program trying to reduce milfoil by suction harvesting, but the problem remains. The White River Lake District Board has learned that it's important to vary the management methods of aquatic invasive species. Chemical treatment by Wisconsin Lake and Pond Resource LLC (WLPR) has been found to be quite effective for nearby lakes.

A proposal from WLPR has two suggested chemicals to consider, one with potentially better results; the minutes of our Board meeting and the proposal of WLPR has been attached to this email. Because WLPR wants to get us on their calendar as soon as possible, your Board is seeking your permission to sign a contract with WLPR for the application of ProcellaCOR in 2022. The ProcellaCOR costs of \$10,245.88 plus an additional \$4,000 (which is what we typically spend) for other lake district expenses would be covered by our income from lake district members at the annual lake district fee of \$150 which was approved for 2022.

### 2021/12/16 vote on ProcellaCOR usage

Eurasian Water Milfoil, an Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS), continues to be a problem on our lake. Your Board has explored what other lakes have done to deal with the problem. Several local lakes have contracted Wisconsin Lake and Pond Resource LLC (WLPR) to apply herbicides to their lake with good success. Your Board requested a proposal from WLPR and has researched the two options that WLPR presented. While more expensive, ProcellaCOR has the longest lasting effect. Your Board unanimously approved a motion to proceed with ProcellaCOR in 2022 at a total cost of \$10,245.88 pending lake district members' approval. The Lake District Board can only authorize additional spending of \$5,000 without lake district members' approval. Because the contract with WLPR has to be signed prior to our Memorial Lake District meeting, the Board is seeking your approval to proceed with ProcellaCOR.
